Student Activities

There are 29 active clubs/organizations on campus. There are some new deadlines and requirements starting this fall, which are listed below.

Two hundred thirteen students (213) were approved for the PSEOP at Stark State College for the 2006-2007 school year. One hundred ninety (190) students are currently enrolled in classes. Four of the students not enrolled this semester are freshmen, who may only enroll for one class during the spring

Disability Support Services (DSS)

DSS serves 440 students. Approximately 90 new students have registered with DSS for this semester. Students who have a qualified disability may receive academic accommodations, such as extended test time, books on tape, enlarged print materials, sign language interpreters, the use of a CCTV (closed circuit television to enlarge viewing of materials), and note takers.

If asked to be a note taker, please consider volunteering for this position. A note taker should have good attendance and take readable, useful notes so that a student who struggles with this area has access to notes from class. Note takers are appreciated with a stipend of approximately \$40 some time after the semester has ended.

In order to serve a larger number of students, DSS is in the

process of moving extended time testing and distraction-reduced testing to the computer testing room. Questions about testing changes should be directed to Melody Lee at ext. 4754.
