Post-Secondary Enrollment Option (PSEO)

Two hundred twenty-five (225) students have been accepted for the 2007-08 PSEO program. Two hundred four (204) students are enrolled for a total of 1,565 credits. This includes 17 Dual Enrollment students, 7 in Glen Oak EMT class and 10 in Effective Speaking at Wayne County Career Center. In addition, we are offering math at Wayne County Career Center and four dual enroll-

ment classes at Lake High School. Other classes will be offered second semester. Dennis Trenger and Waneta Petty will be working to provide more dual enrollment opportunities for the 2008-09 school year.
