The event featured comments from donor Dick Mautz and three student speakers, who shared their inspiring success stories.

#### **Rachel Ligas**

The Dale and Marguerite Young Scholarship is one of the reasons Rachel Ligas, a first-generation college student in a family of nine children, had the opportunity to attend college and work towards her dream of becoming a pharmacist.

Rachel, taking an SSC associate degree in chemistry and biology to the four-year NEOMED doctoral pharmacy program, thanked her donors for their help and inspiration. "After I graduate, I want to give back to the community the same way that you have and help more students follow their educational dreams."

#### **Nick Harrison**

Nick Harrison found Stark State "a great place to get a top-notch education." He switched from a civil engineering program at a four-year university to capitalize on the rising growth of the oil and gas industry.

Awarded a Chevron ShaleNET Scholarship, Nick is finishing a degree in industrial process operations, and he's found small class sizes, weekly conversations with an advisor, hands-on lab experience and state-of-the-art equipment have given him a great opportunity to succeed. "A decision to attend Stark State is like joining a big family who cares about you and wants to see you succeed as an individual, no matter what it takes. That includes donors who provide scholarships and the best tools and equipment possible."

#### Juan Nunez Castillo

Two years ago, Juan Nunez Castillo arrived in the United States from Nicaragua with a dream. What he didn't have: English-speaking skills or any idea what the future held.

After finishing high school in Dover, Juan was torn between finding a job or finding the funds for college. With the help of financial aid and scholarships, Juan found the help he needed to continue his education in 3D animation and computer engineering.

George graduated from Stark State College with a degree in electrical engineering in 1965. After a 25-year career with Fortune 500 company AMETEK, he founded Technical Products Group, Inc. A well-known community leader, George has served many organizations, including the Pro Football Hall of Fame, Canton Museum of Art, United Way, Goodwill Industries, Canton Regional Chamber of Commerce and the Greater Stark County Urban League. George was past chair of the Alumni Advisory Council, 2003 Alumnus of the Year and the 2010 Ohio Association of Community College's Alumnus of the Year.

In 2002, George created the George W. Lemon Endowed Scholarship, awarded to an exceptional business student. Most recently, as president of the Stark State College Foundation, George presided over a goal-breaking fundraising year.

Retirement from the Timken Company did not slow Dick Mautz down. With a love of cars and desire to help Stark State students afford college, Dick works with co-directors Mike Johnson and Dan Thoma to organize and present the annual Canton Carnival of Wheels.

This fundraising event showcases more than 500 vehicles from classic cars to hot rods, as well as tractors and motorcycles, with proceeds going to the Stark State College Automotive Technology Scholarship Fund. Since it began in 2009, Canton Carnival of Wheels has donated more than \$52,000 toward student scholarships.

## Looking forward: culinary focus

The culinary arts major at Stark State College is a newer program preparing students for a competitive market and growing industry in our region. Not only are students being taught about the industry, cooking and management, but also the curriculum includes sustainable environmental education and practices, including organic foods and the benefits of buying locally.

The College has invested more than \$800,000 in refurbishment of a state-of-the-art kitchen and teaching space for the program, incorporating many recyclable materials and environmentally friendly products. A wish list for the future includes plans for a small greenhouse and herb garden (estimated cost of \$20,000), as well a variety of new equipment to accommodate more students (ranging



from \$1,000 to \$5,000). The Foundation plans to focus funding efforts on the culinary arts program during the 2015-16 academic year.
