\*\*\*For the Social Science elective, taking SOC121 is recommended since SOC121 will fulfill the Integrative Core Social Science Foundation requirement at UMU and it is very reasonable for CJS students to double-major or minor in Sociology (double major can double count 3 courses and CRJ major/SOC minor can double count 2 courses).  
Students interested in the Forensic Studies concentration, it is recommended to take CHM105 for the Natural Sciences elective.

It is very important that the students become familiar with the writing guide used in the Mount Union Criminal Justice Program.

\* Natural Science w/Lab elective must be at least 4 credit hours at Stark State to transfer as the Natural Science Foundation requirement at UMU. Students interested in the Forensic Studies concentration, it is recommended they take CHM 105 at Stark State. However, it will not count as the Natural Science Foundation requirement.

Total minimum number of hours needed to graduate is 128.  
Student must complete a minimum of 48 hours at UMU, of which a minimum of 16 in the major.  
A minor is required at UMU.  
A course in public speaking (or an equivalent) is a prerequisite for TRF 200. It is strongly recommended that students take this at Stark State College.  
In the Criminal Justice major, there are 4 concentrations: Law Enforcement; Community Corrections; Forensic Studies; and Criminology. All criminal justice majors must complete one (only one) of the four concentrations.  
\*\*Students may transfer or test out of the foreign language proficiency, but will need to take elective credits in their place if they do so.
