In order to comply with the social distancing guidelines outlined by the college, monthly face-to-face informational meetings have been cancelled until further notice.

**COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE:**

**SELECTIVE ADMISSION:**

- 60 students accepted in the Basic Day program
  - 4 semesters
  - Fall admission at Main Campus
- 24 students accepted in the Evening/Weekend program
  - 4 semesters
  - Fall admission at Main Campus
  - We guarantee 5 seats in the Evening/Weekend program (not the day program) for current Mercy employees. If you currently work at Mercy, please attach a copy of your badge or paystub to your application.
- 24 students accepted in the LPN to RN program
  - 3 semesters
  - Fall admission at Main Campus
- 24 students accepted in the LPN to RN Wayne Campus program
  - 3 semesters
  - Spring admission Wayne Campus
- 24 students accepted in the Paramedic to RN Main campus program
  - 3 semesters
  - Fall admission at Main Campus
- Acceptance into all programs are based on a points system comprised of your GPA, TEAS test scores, and completed pre-requisite classes.
- Students applying to the Basic Day or Evening/Weekend program may only make ONE selection.
- The breakdown of points on page two of the application. Students with the top scores in their applied cohort will be offered a seat in the program. The minimum score is determined by the number of qualified applications we receive but we encourage students to reach for a score of, at least, 15 to improve their chances.
- **There is no waiting list.** Qualified re-applicants will receive two (2) additional points toward their overall score if they reapply within two years.

**GPA:**

You must have a **minimum GPA of 3.0** in seven (7) hours or more of course work at the last college you attended. Your most recent overall (cumulative) GPA will be considered.

**CURRICULUM:** Please review the Basic Curriculum sheet. These are all of the courses required to complete the ADN program and you must have a minimum grade of a “C” (or 70%) in all courses listed. **All the items listed in the Pre-Nursing column of the attached Curriculum Sheet must be completed prior to applying to the program.** If you are still in the process of completing any of these courses, your application will not be considered.

### Basic Day & Evening/Weekend

- SSC101: Student Success Seminar
  - If you transfer in 24+ credit hours with a GPA of 2.5 or better; or you already have a degree; or you have been a Stark State student since Summer 2012, you do not need to complete SSC101.
- MTH124: Statistics
- BIO101: Intro to Anatomy and Physiology
  - The minimum grade requirement must be met by the third attempt, including withdraws, and within 7 years.
  - You may apply for Prior Learning Assessment if you have taken high school biology within the last 3 years and received a grade of ‘B’ or higher; or a higher level Anatomy and Physiology course.
  - If you completed A&P1 and/or A&P2 you do not need to take BIO101. If you have taken BIO101 and BIO121 you may use whichever grade is higher on your application.

### **CLASS TIMES:**

- Basic Day—Class and lab are 2-3 days a week plus one full day of clinical. Class times can begin as early as 7:30am and run as late as 5pm. Clinical times are typically 7am-3pm or 8am-4pm.
- Evening/Weekend—Class and lab are 2-3 days a week beginning at 5pm and can run as late as 10pm. Clinical is typically every other weekend, both Saturday and Sunday, from 7am-4pm.
- LPN to RN and Paramedic to RN—Class and lab are one day a week plus one full day of clinical. Class times can begin as early as 7:30am and run as late as 5pm. Clinical times are typically 7am-3pm or 8am-4pm
- Days and times are subject to change due to facility availability.

**TEAS TEST:**

- All students applying to the ADN program are required to successfully complete the TEAS test prior to submitting their application.
- The minimum score we will accept on the TEAS test is a **58.7%**. You can take the test twice within a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 60 days to retake the test if you wish to improve your scores.
- Scores are valid for three years.
- The test is written on a high school level and covers Math, Science, Reading, and English/Language. Study guides are available in the Stark State Bookstore and at [www.atitesting.com](http://www.atitesting.com).
- There is a \$60 fee to take the test at Stark State College.

**BACKGROUND CHECK:**

- You must obtain a background check from Stark State Security. They require you to make an appointment and results may take up to 45 days to return.
- The cost is \$70 and can be paid at the Cashier's Office on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Student Services Building.
- A list of Disqualifying Offences is attached. If any of these items come back on your background check, you may not be able to participate in the nursing program. Please contact us if you have questions about a specific item that may be listed on your background check.
- Once you receive your results, submit the EMAIL stating your eligibility status along with your application and TEAS test results to the Nursing Department.

**ITEMS TO SUBMIT:**

1. The front of the application. \*Note: You may only select ONE program—*Day or Evening/Weekend*
2. TEAS test scores with each section listed (make sure your name is visible)
3. Email from SSC Security stating eligibility (we don't need the actual background check—just the email)
4. *Mercy employee applicants must provide proof of employment if applying to the evening/weekend program.*
5. *LPN to RN applicants must provide a copy of their LPN license from the Ohio Lookup website.*
6. *Paramedic to RN applicants must provide a copy of their paramedic certification.*

**ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS OF A STUDENT IN THE NURSING PROGRAM**

It is important to be aware of essential functions required of nurses in the performance of day-to-day role responsibilities in order to provide for the health and safety of patients. A Registered Nurse has job related physical demands rating of Medium Work (U.S. Department of Labor) which implies frequent 20 pounds lifting and infrequent lifting of 50 pounds and over.

**Typical physical job demands of nurses include:** continuous standing, prolonged walking, prolonged sitting, pushing/pulling, supporting, twisting, bending, squatting, reaching forward and reaching overhead in the provision of patient care and manipulating and using equipment related to patient care. Nurses are expected to routinely work 12-hour shifts both day and night.

**Other Essential Functions include but are not limited to:**

**Gross and fine motor skills:** sufficient skills to provide safe and effective nursing care. (i.e. perform vital signs, CPR, drawing up and giving injections, hanging IV's and tube feedings).

**Skills of observation:** accurate visual, auditory and tactile observation of patients (i.e. listening to breath and heart sounds, discriminating subtle changes in color, hearing alarms, call bells, cries for helps by clients and staff); accurate visual, auditory and tactile observation of instruments, therapeutic devices and measuring devices (i.e. read electronic charts, monitors and thermometers, manipulate an intravenous infusion device).

**Communication:** speak, write and use English language effectively, use computers and interpret nonverbal communication while maintaining sensitivity to individual cultural and economic differences (i.e. ability to use electronic documentation and communication devices, follow verbal and written instructions, provide effective client teaching, and consult and communicate with other health care providers in a professional manner).

**Analytical Skills/Critical Thinking:** skills sufficient to process and interpret information, to transfer knowledge from one situation to another and to prioritize tasks, and problem solve in a timely manner.

**Professionalism, Ethics and Conduct:** personal conduct, dress and hygiene that is professional, safe, ethical, and legal in accordance with the Ohio Nurse Practice Act and ANA's *Nursing Code of Ethics*, ANA's *Standards of Practice*, and NLN Core Values.

Reasonable accommodations may be provided for any qualified student with a documented condition. It is the responsibility of the student to request reasonable accommodation as early as possible. Students seeking accommodations must seek services through the Disability Services.

## Additional Considerations

### Felony and Misdemeanor Convictions

- ▶ According to Section 4723.28 of the *Ohio Revised Code*, nursing students are responsible for informing the Department Chair/Director of Nursing, early and during the program, of any misdemeanor or felony convictions so that students may be informed of the steps the Ohio Board of Nursing will take before considering their application to sit for the licensing examination. According to *Ohio HB327*, anyone previously convicted of, pleaded guilty to, or had a judicial finding of guilt for an egregious felony will be precluded from initial licensure. Egregious felonies are aggravated murder, murder, voluntary manslaughter, felonious assault, kidnapping, rape, sexual battery, gross sexual imposition, aggravated arson, aggravated robbery and aggravated burglary.
- ▶ Any student who has been convicted of an egregious felony will not be admitted to the nursing program.
- ▶ Any student who is convicted of an egregious felony while enrolled in the nursing program will be dismissed and not be readmitted.

### Criminal Background Checks

- ▶ If you have been convicted of certain felonies or misdemeanors, you may be refused placement at clinical/practicum site. You must complete placements at clinical/practicum sites in order to obtain your degree in certain programs. Also, certain convictions may make you ineligible to take the licensure or certification examinations. Therefore, in order to guide your program decision at Stark State, both FBI and BCI Criminal Background checks must be done PRIOR to application to a health program through the Stark State Security Office located on the first floor of the S Building.
- ▶ You will receive the results of the background checks in the mail along with a letter stating whether you may be refused placement at clinical/practicum sites or may be ineligible for licensure in the future. Background checks may have to be repeated upon program entry if more than a year has passed since the original background check, or unless there is an indication that the applicant's background has changed. Annual background checks are required for clinical placement. Within one year of graduation, the student should also request a copy of the background check be sent to the Ohio Board of Nursing in preparation for taking the NCLEX licensure exam.

*Criminal background checks will be required for all students prior to application to a Health Sciences program. It is a Health and Public Services Division policy to refer to various sections of the Ohio Law & Regulations for certification and licensure boards that persons convicted of certain felonies or misdemeanors may wish not to pursue health programs at Stark State College because that person may not be able to take the licensure or certification examinations, may be refused acceptance of placement by the clinical/practicum sites, or may have restrictions placed on their ability to practice. For more information, refer to Ohio Revised Code Section 3701-13-05 or contact the applicable licensure/certification board.*

### ***Do I receive my Registered Nurse license upon graduation?***

Successful completion of the program meets state and national eligibility requirements to sit for the National Licensing Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN).

### ***Is the program accredited?***

Stark State College's Associate Degree in Nursing Program has FULL approval from the Ohio Board of Nursing and is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).

### ***Is financial aid available?***

Yes. SSC's Financial Aid Office can provide information related to available grants, loans, and scholarships. Call (330) 494-6170, ext. 4301 to make an appointment.

### ***Can I attend part-time?***

Students who complete all or most of their non-nursing courses prior to enrolling will have reduced course loads roughly equivalent to part-time study. Students may take all non-nursing courses on a part-time basis prior to entering the Nursing Program. Students must complete the nursing courses in sequence as listed.

### ***What if I took the PAX test in the past?***

The PAX test results are no longer acceptable, you must take the TEAS test.

### ***Do I have to be licensed to practice nursing?***

Yes. To apply for a license in any state, one must graduate from an approved program, apply for licensure in the respective state, and pass the National Licensing Examination (NCLEX-RN).

### ***Are there job opportunities available?***

Yes. Associate Degree Nurses are employed in a variety of health care settings. Graduates are encouraged to continue their education, working toward a bachelor degree in nursing, to further expand their employment opportunities.

### ***Can credits earned in the program be transferred or applied to a baccalaureate degree?***

Yes. Graduates can easily matriculate into the various local college and university BSN programs. The Associate Degree Nursing program has written articulation agreements to continue with an RN to BSN program at other Universities.

### ***Can I transfer in credits from other colleges?***

Please refer to the SSC Catalog regarding transfer of courses. The Admissions Department evaluates transcripts in relation to transferability of course work.

While courses may be transferred with a grade of "C-" or "D" from another university or college, the Nursing Department will not accept those courses transferred with a "C-" or "D" toward graduation requirements. All non-nursing courses in the nursing curriculum must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.

### ***What do I need to know about the application procedure for licensure?***

Candidates who wish to sit for the NCLEX-RN (Registered Nursing Licensing Examination) will be required to submit their fingerprints to the Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation (BCII) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). # TEAS Test Information for Nursing Students

The TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) Test is required as part of the admission process for the nursing program. The subjects covered are Math, Science, Reading, and English/Language. You must take the TEAS test within 3 years of applying to the nursing program. All applications after March 1, 2016 will require the TEAS test.

## 1. PROCESS:

- a. Visit the Cashier's Office located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Student Center (Main Campus) for payment. The testing fee is \$65 per test. There are **NO** refunds if you do not show for your scheduled test. This includes being asked to leave by one of the proctors for not following testing guidelines.
- b. To register for the TEAS test, provide a copy of your receipt to the Test Center via e-mail ([testcenter@starkstate.edu](mailto:testcenter@starkstate.edu)) **OR** visit C107 in person to sign up.
- c. Provide your **first and last name; student number, cell phone number, and requested test date.**

## 2. RETAKES:

- a. Students must wait 60 calendar days from their last test to take the test again.
- b. Students are permitted to take the TEAS test **twice** within a calendar year.

## 3. PRIOR TO TESTING:

- a. Go to website: [www.atitesting.com/teas](http://www.atitesting.com/teas) PRIOR to coming to take the test and **CREATE AN ACCOUNT**. This information is located on the right-hand side of the website under username and password.
  - Under school – look under “S” for Stark State College.
  - Under anticipated date of graduation – select any date in the future.
  - Under employee code – leave this request blank

## IN-PERSON TESTING:

- b. Bring your photo ID to the testing center 15 minutes before your scheduled test time. Late students will need to reschedule.
  - No personal belongings are allowed on the desk.
  - You cannot bring a calculator; however, a calculator is embedded within the exam.
  - You **MUST** have your cell phone OFF. If you look at your phone, you will be asked to leave the test and no refund will be given.
  - You may not talk to other students during the test nor look at another computer screen. Academic dishonesty, or suspicion of such, is not tolerated.
  - Remember that any question that is not answered on the test, will be marked wrong. It is better to guess than to leave a blank or not finish the test.
  - You can take breaks **ONLY** between test sections.



- You will receive your results immediately after you complete the test. You will always have access under the “results” tab on [www.atitesting.com](http://www.atitesting.com) to print your results. Please print a copy to attach to your nursing application.

#### **Social distancing guidelines for everyone's safety**
