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## Program Information

### General Description

The ADN program is a two-year program that admits students two times each year. There are 5 cohorts:

- Day - Main Campus (Fall admission)
- Evening/Weekend - Main Campus (Fall admission)
- LPN to RN - Main Campus (Fall admission)
- LPN to RN - Akron Campus (Spring admission)
- Paramedic to RN - Main Campus (Fall admission)

## Admission Requirements

All students applying to the ADN program must complete the following prior to applying:

### COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE:

Follow the procedure for applying to Stark State College (SSC). See procedures on the SSC website under Admissions (<http://www.starkstate.edu/admissions>). All students must be accepted to Stark State College prior to applying to the ADN program.

## NURSING PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### GPA Requirement:

- Minimum 3.0 GPA in seven (7) credit hours or more at the last college you attended. Your overall GPA will be considered.

### Pre-requisite Requirements:

- Day **and** Evening/Weekend Cohorts: SSC101; ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO101
  - Evening/Weekend students must complete BIO121 prior to beginning the program
- LPN to RN **and** Paramedic to RN Cohorts: ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO121

### TEAS Test:

- All students applying to the ADN program are required to successfully complete the TEAS test prior to submitting their application.
- The minimum score accepted is **58.7%**. You can take the test twice within a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 60 days to retake the test if you wish to improve your scores.
- The test is written on a high school level and covers Math, Science, Reading, and English/Language. Study guides are available in the Stark State Bookstore and at [www.atitesting.com](http://www.atitesting.com).

### Background Check:

- You must obtain a background check from Stark State Security. They require you to make an appointment and results may take up to 45 days to return.
- The cost is \$70 and can be paid at the Cashier's Office on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Student Services Building.
- Once you receive your results, submit the EMAIL stating your eligibility status along with your application and TEAS test results to the Nursing Department.

## ADN Acceptance

- Students may only apply to ONE cohort.
- Acceptance into all programs is based on a points system comprised of your GPA, TEAS test scores, and completed pre-requisite classes. (See page 15 for worksheet) Students with the top scores in their applied cohort will be offered a seat in the program. The minimum score is determined by the number of qualified applications received; however, we encourage students to achieve a score of, at least, 15 to improve their probability of earning a seat.
- All students must have a **minimum GPA of 3.0** in seven (7) hours or more of course work at the last college you attended. Your overall GPA will be considered.
- **There is no waiting list.** Qualified re-applicants will receive two (2) additional points toward their overall score if they reapply within two years.

### *Additional Items*

- *Mercy employee applicants must provide proof of employment if applying to the evening/weekend program.*
- *LPN to RN applicants must provide a copy of their LPN license from the Ohio Lookup website.*
- *Paramedic to RN applicants must provide a copy of their paramedic certification.*

**APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED WITHOUT AN ELIGIBILITY LETTER FROM SECURITY AND/OR TEAS RESULTS OR APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THE DEADLINE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.**

### **DEADLINE:**

March 31<sup>st</sup> for Fall consideration & October 31<sup>st</sup> for Spring (LPN Akron) consideration. Applicants can expect to receive an email regarding their status by the beginning of May for fall admission and mid-November for spring admission.

## Additional Considerations

### **Immunization Requirements**

- Valid Basic Life Support (BLS) Certification
- Physical Examination performed by a medical professional within 12 months of beginning the program
- Influenza Vaccine
- COVID-19 Vaccination—2-shot series of Moderna or Pfizer, plus booster; or 1-shot Johnson & Johnson, plus booster (see COVID Advising Form on page 17)
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)—2 vaccines within last 10 years or positive antibody titer
- Varicella—2 vaccines within last 10 years or positive antibody titer
- Hepatitis B—3 vaccines within last 10 years or positive antibody titer
- Tuberculosis (TB)—initial test must be a 2-step with a 1-step each year after or negative QuantiFERON gold blood draw
- Tetanus, Diphtheria & Pertussis (Tdap)—booster within last 10 years
- 10-panel urine or blood drug screen

*\* Some students cannot be vaccinated because of identified medical exemptions, medical deferments or religious accommodations and may be exempted or deferred from receiving the vaccine. If you believe you should be exempt from this vaccine for any of these reasons, please reach out to the Program Coordinator/Clinical Coordinator to receive a copy of the exemption/deferral forms.*

### PRE-REQUISITES:

Please review the attached Curriculum sheet. These are all of the courses required to complete the ADN program and you must have a minimum grade of a "C" (or 70%) in all non-nursing courses. **All the items listed in the *Pre-Nursing* column of the attached Curriculum Sheet must be completed prior to applying to the program.** If you are still in the process of completing any of these courses, your application will not be considered.

### Pre-requisite Courses:

- SSC101: Student Success Seminar
  - If you transfer in 24+ credit hours with a GPA of 2.5 or better; or you already have a degree; or you have been a Stark State student since Summer 2012, you do not need to complete SSC101.
- MTH124: Statistics
- BIO101: Intro to Anatomy and Physiology
  - You may apply for Prior Learning Assessment if you have taken high school biology within the last 3 years and received a grade of 'B' or higher; or a higher-level Anatomy and Physiology course.
  - If you completed A&P1 and/or A&P2 you do not need to take BIO101. If you have taken BIO101 and BIO121 you may use whichever grade is higher on your application.
  - BIO123 may be accepted in place of BIO121

- *If you are applying to the Evening/Weekend program, you must successfully complete BIO121 (A&P1) by the end of the summer semester.*

### CLASS/LAB/CLINICAL TIMES:

- **Day** class and lab are 2-3 days per week. Class times can begin as early as 7:30am and run as late as 5pm. Clinical times are typically 7am-4pm one additional day each week.
- **Evening/Weekend** class and lab are 2-3 days per week from 5pm -10pm.; clinical is Saturday and Sunday of every other weekend, 7am-4pm.

## TEAS Test Information for Nursing Students

The TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) Test is required as part of the admission process for the nursing program. The subjects covered are Math, Science, Reading, and English/Language. You must successfully complete the TEAS test within 3 years of applying to the nursing program. All applications to the ADN require successful completion of the TEAS test.

### 1. PROCESS:

- a. Visit the Cashier's Office located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the Student Center (Main Campus) for payment. The testing fee is **\$65 per test**. There are **NO** refunds if you do not show for your scheduled test. This includes being asked to leave by one of the proctors for not following testing guidelines.
- b. To register for the TEAS test, provide a copy of your receipt to the Test Center via e-mail ([testcenter@starkstate.edu](mailto:testcenter@starkstate.edu)) **OR** visit C107 in person to sign up.
- c. Provide your **first and last name; student number, cell phone number, and requested test date**.

### 2. RETAKES:

- a. Students are permitted to take the TEAS test **twice** within a calendar year.
- b. Students must wait 60 calendar days from their last test to take the test again.
- c. Applicants are encouraged to utilize remediation resources before retesting.

### 3. PRIOR TO TESTING:

- a. Go to website: [www.atitesting.com/teas](http://www.atitesting.com/teas) and **CREATE AN ACCOUNT**.
  - Under school – look under "S" for Stark State College.
  - Under anticipated date of graduation – select any date in the future.
  - Under employee code – leave this request blank

### 4. IN-PERSON TESTING:

- a. The TEAS test is offered at the Stark State Main Campus location.
- b. Bring your photo ID to the testing center 15 minutes before your scheduled test time. Late students will need to reschedule.
  - No personal items are allowed at the desk. Lockers are provided where you can store your belongings. All electronics including, but not limited to, cell phones, smart watches, & earbuds/headphones, will not be permitted in the testing area.
  - You cannot bring a calculator; a calculator is embedded within the exam.
  - Breaks may be taken between test sections **ONLY**.
  - Students found in violation of Stark State's Academic Honesty & Integrity (3357:15-13-26) will be removed from the testing area and no testing refund will be given.
  - You will receive your results immediately after you complete the test. You will always have access under the "results" tab on [www.atitesting.com](http://www.atitesting.com) to print your results. Please print a copy to attach to your nursing application.
