

RN-BSN COMPLETION PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

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The Registered Nurse (RN) to Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Pathway Program at Stark State College offers a flexible and affordable pathway for licensed RNs to advance their education and career. With the growing need for BSN-prepared nurses—especially at hospitals seeking or maintaining American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) Magnet® status—this program supports nurses expand their nursing knowledge, leadership skills, and impact on patient care.

Stark State's RN to BSN program is designed to build on your associate degree or diploma in nursing, allowing for a seamless transition to baccalaureate-level study. Whether you're a recent graduate or a working RN, the fully online coursework with in-person practicums makes it easier to balance school, work, and life while reaching your professional goals.

RN-BSN ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

APPLICATION:

1. Submit an [application to Stark State College](#) (SSC) if you have not enrolled in classes at the college for 2 or more years. Include submission of all college transcripts with SSC application.
2. Submit [application for RN-BSN Completion](#) program (see instructions on page 3).

EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND:

3. Must have an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) or a nursing diploma from a nationally accredited nursing program.
4. Students receive 33 credits for the blanket transfer of nursing courses from their Associate Degree in Nursing Program, provided they have earned a grade of "C" or better in each course.

GPA STANDARDS: Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.

PREREQUISITE COURSEWORK:

5. 15-30 credits of the Ohio Transfer 36 Model completed in either Stark State College's Associate Degree Nursing Program or another college's program are required prior to program admission. These should include approved general education courses such as ENG124, MTH124, PSY121, PSY123, SOC121, and BIO221. Most ADN graduates from Ohio institutions have met this minimum.
6. All prerequisite coursework must be completed with a **grade of "C" or better**.

LICENSURE: Must have an active, unencumbered Ohio or Compact Multi-state RN license.

RESIDENCY: Must be a **permanent resident of Ohio**. Practicum experiences will occur at **SSC-affiliated healthcare facilities**.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION: Submit **two professional letters** regarding clinical competence, professionalism, and readiness for baccalaureate-level study:

7. One from a current or former supervisor
8. One from either former nursing faculty or licensed health professional colleagues

BACKGROUND CHECK: Must complete a background check through **SSC Security** indicating eligibility for the program.

HOW TO SUBMIT APPLICATION

1. Submit an [application to Stark State College](#) (SSC) if you have not enrolled in classes at the college for 2 or more years. Include submission of all college transcripts with SSC application.
2. Complete the [RN-BSN Pathway Program Application](#) and upload all required admission documents per link below.
3. Submit all required documents (2 letters of recommendation, background check eligibility letter from SSC Security, RN licensure, application and selective admission sheet) to [this drop box link](#) by **July 31st** for fall admission consideration.

RN-BSN ACCEPTANCE (SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS AND WAITLIST INFORMATION)

ACCEPTANCE is competitive and based on the following:

- Meeting all admission requirements
- Selective Admission Score (points awarded based on GPA, course grades, SSC graduate status, RN experience, and completion of recommended general education courses) – Refer to **page 9** for details.
- Number of seats available (**36 seats per fall start**)

WAITLIST INFORMATION:

- Applicants who meet admission requirements but are not offered a seat will be placed on a waitlist for the next fall start date.
- Waitlisted applicants must resubmit all updated application documents to be reconsidered for the next admission cycle.
- Additional points toward Selective Admission Score are awarded for:
 - Completion of additional required general education courses
 - Reapplying after being placed on the waitlist.

ENCOURAGEMENT FOR WAITLISTED STUDENTS: Students are encouraged to complete the following general education courses while on the waitlist:

- NTR121 – Nutrition for Health
- PHL122 – Ethics
- PSY220 – Social Psychology
- ENG231 – College Composition II
- SOC225 – Diversity in American Society

RN-BSN COMPLETION PROGRAM COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- Students must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all courses (both technical and non-technical) to progress and graduate.
- Technical courses are delivered online; non-technical courses are offered in-person or online.
- The program culminates with practicum courses in the final semester:
 - NSG440 – Leadership and Management in Nursing (5 credits)
 - NSG450 – Advancing Roles in Professional Nursing (5 credits)
 - Practicum hours for NSG440 and NSG450 must be completed at SSC-affiliated healthcare facilities.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- Varying health requirements are necessary to participate in the RN-BSN Pathway Program.
- **Before program start:** Students must complete a drug screen and submit a Health Report Form (physical) through ACEMAPP.
- Detailed instructions and a comprehensive list of required health documentation will be provided upon admission to the program.
- All health documentation must be completed before beginning practicum courses in the second year.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)**Q: What happens if I am placed on the waitlist?**

A: You will be notified of your waitlist status and encouraged to complete additional general education courses to strengthen your application for the next cycle.

Q: Can I continue coursework while on the waitlist?

A: Yes. Completing courses such as NTR121, PHL122, PSY220, ENG231, and SOC225 will improve your Selective Admission Score.

Q: How will I know if I am accepted?

A: Applicants will be notified after the application review process is complete following the July 31st deadline.

Q: Are all RN-BSN courses online?

A: Yes, all courses are online except for practicum experiences, which are arranged with SSC-affiliated healthcare facilities.

Q: Is there a Spring start option?

A: No, admission is offered only for the Fall semester each year.
