Thank you for your interest in the Stark State College Associate Degree in Nursing Program. This packet will provide you with information pertaining to the Nursing Program and the admissions process. Please note, all information is subject to change as needed to assure a high-quality program.

The nursing curriculum at Stark State College can be quite rigorous; that is why it's important to prioritize your education and ensuring your support system is on board to help you achieve your goals. Throughout the program, you will learn from instructors with a minimum Master's degree in Nursing, and many of whom still work in the field. Our dedication to meeting each students' educational needs and professional goals is our top priority. 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PROGRAM INFORMATION

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The ADN program is a two-year program following completion of Required Nursing Support Courses

- Concept-Based Day Cohort - Main Campus (Fall admission)
- Concept-Based Evening/Weekend Cohort - Main Campus (Fall admission)

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All students applying to the ADN program must complete the following prior to applying:

COLLEGE ACCEPTANCE:

Follow the procedure for applying to Stark State College (SSC). See procedures on the SSC website under Admissions (<http://www.starkstate.edu/admissions>). All students must be accepted to Stark State College prior to applying to the ADN program.

NURSING PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

GPA REQUIREMENT:

- Minimum 3.0 GPA in Required Nursing Support Courses (ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO101) AND a minimum of 2.5 overall GPA
- Students with Certified Nurse Aide Certification AND a letter of recommendation from current director/supervisor will be accepted with a Minimum 2.75 GPA in Required Nursing Support Courses (ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO101) AND a minimum of 2.5 overall GPA
- Transfer students' overall GPA requirement: minimum GPA of 2.5 in seven (7) hours or more of course work at the last college you attended.

REQUIRED NURSING SUPPORT COURSES PRIOR TO ADMISSION:

- Day and Evening/Weekend Cohorts: SSC101; ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO101
- Evening/Weekend students are recommended to complete BIO121 prior to beginning the program
- Must achieve grade of C or above in SSC101; ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO101 for admission to the ADN program.
- Successful completion of SSC101: Student Success Seminar course **OR** the 3-credit IDS115 College Success Skills course (transfer students with 24 credit hours with at least a 2.5 GPA or with an existing degree from an accredited college do not need to take SSC101)

TEAS ENTRANCE EXAM:

- All students applying to the ADN program are required to successfully complete the TEAS test prior to submitting their application. For information on the TEAS follow [this link](#)
- The minimum score accepted is **58.7%**. You can take the test twice within a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 60 days to retake the test if you wish to improve your scores.
- Nursing Program will accept TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) test scores for up to three (3)

years from the date of the exam.

- The test is written on a high school level and covers Math, Science, Reading, and English/Language. Study guides are available in the Stark State Bookstore and at www.atitesting.com.

BACKGROUND CHECK:

- You must obtain a background check from Stark State Security. They require you to make an appointment and results may take up to 45 days to return.
- The cost is \$70 and can be paid at the Cashier's Office on the 3rd floor of the Student Services Building.
- Once you receive your results, submit the letter from SSC Security stating your eligibility status with your application.

ADN ACCEPTANCE

- Acceptance into all programs is based on a points system comprised of your GPA, TEAS test scores, and completed pre-requisite classes. **See page 9** for the **Selective Admission Worksheet**. Students with the top scores in their applied cohort will be offered a seat in the program. The minimum score is determined by the number of qualified applications received.
- **There is no waiting list.** Qualified re-applicants will receive two (2) additional points toward their overall score if they reapply within two years.
- Applicants with a Certified Nurse Aide Certification AND a letter of recommendation from current director/supervisor will receive an additional 2 points toward their overall application score.

APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED WITHOUT AN ELIGIBILITY LETTER FROM SECURITY AND / OR TEAS RESULTS OR APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THE DEADLINE WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

DEADLINE:

March 31st for Fall consideration. Applicants can expect to receive an email regarding their status by the beginning of May.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- Due to community healthcare facility policies, all nursing students will be required to show proof of health requirements prior to clinical experiences, A list of health requirements is included in the link above for your convenience, as some require planning.
- Students are discouraged from obtaining these requirements prior to receiving an acceptance offer for the ADN program. Please pay special attention to the dates, as the earliest that some can be completed is mid-May. This is due to early expiration and will ensure the requirements remain up-to-

date for the entirety of the spring and fall semesters. Health requirements will be discussed in more detail at the new student orientation session, which will be announced following acceptance into the program.

- **Note:** Some students cannot be vaccinated because of identified medical exemptions, medical deferments or religious accommodations and may be exempted or deferred from receiving the vaccine. If you believe you should be exempt from this vaccine for any of these reasons, please reach out to the Program Coordinator/Clinical Coordinator to receive a copy of the exemption/deferral forms.

DAY & EVENING/WEEKEND CONCEPT-BASED PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

REQUIRED NURSING SUPPORT COURSES:

- Please review the attached Curriculum sheet. These are all of the courses required to complete the ADN program and [the items listed in the Pre- Nursing column of the attached Curriculum Sheet must be completed prior to applying to the program](#)
- SSC101: Student Success Seminar
 - ⊕ If you transfer in 24+ credit hours with a GPA of 2.5 or better; or you already have a degree; or you have been a Stark State student since Summer 2012, you do not need to complete SSC101.
- MTH124: Statistics
- BIO101: Intro to Anatomy and Physiology
 - ⊕ You may apply for Prior Learning Assessment if you have taken high school biology within the last 3 years and received a grade of 'B' or higher; or a higher-level Anatomy and Physiology course.
 - ⊕ If you completed A&P1 and/or A&P2 you do not need to take BIO101. If you have taken BIO101 and BIO121 you may use whichever grade is higher on your application.
 - ⊕ BIO123 may be accepted in place of BIO121
 - ⊕ If you have Biology questions specific to your situation, you may contact the department chair of Biology, Edmund Priddis, at epriddis@starkstate.edu.
- PSY121: General Psychology
- ENG124: College Composition
- If you are applying to the Evening/Weekend program, it is highly recommended to successfully complete BIO121 (A&P1) by the end of the summer semester.
- Must achieve grade of C or above in SSC101; ENG124, PSY121, MTH124, and BIO101 for admission.

CLASS/LAB/CLINICAL TIMES:

- **Day class** and lab are 2-3 days per week. Class times can begin as early as 7:30am and run as late as 5pm. Clinical times are typically 7am-4pm one additional day each week.
- **Evening/Weekend class** and lab are 2-3 days per week from 4pm -10pm.; clinical is Saturday and Sunday of every other weekend, 7am-4pm.
- *Days and times are subject to change due to clinical facility availability.
