What is the academic impact of withdrawing from a course?

The academic impact of dropping or withdrawing from a course varies according at which point in the semester you complete the withdrawal/drop process.

- A drop completed by **January 25, 2026** will have no academic penalty.
 - This course will not appear on the student's transcript and we will not bill the district.
- Please contact your school counselor for more information regarding the drop/withdrawal process.
- Students must complete the withdrawal process by **April 13, 2026** to receive a "W" on their transcript.
 - This is the last day to withdraw from a course for the Spring 2026 semester.

To withdraw from a class, the student must meet with their instructor and complete the required paperwork.
